John Knox Named Recipient of 2024 USG Felton Jenkins Jr. Hall of Fame Faculty Award



John Knox, professor of geography and Josiah Meigs Distinguished Teaching Professor has been named the recipient of the University System of Georgia's (USG) 2024 Felton Jenkins Jr. Hall of Fame Faculty Award. According to the USG website, "These system-wide awards will recognize individual faculty and staff for a strong commitment to teaching and student success.

One faculty or staff award will be given for the research and comprehensive universities sector, one for the state university sector, and one for the state college sector for a total of three faculty awards." The University of Georgia has not had a winner of this award since 2015 and UGA has had only seven previous winners since this award was created in 1997. Dr. Knox is the first UGA Geography faculty member to be a recipient. He will be officially recognized at the annual Board of Regents' Scholarship Gala on Thursday, September 12, 2024 at Town Stage at Trilith Studios in Fayetteville, GA. At the event, he and other award winners will be recognized by the Chancellor, the Regents, and the Presidents of the USG universities.



The <u>College of Social and Behavioral Science</u> at the <u>University of Utah</u> is seeking applicants for a Postdoctoral Research Associate with an interest in applying Artificial Intelligence (AI) to US Census data. AI is having far-reaching effects as it moves into everyday systems, such as healthcare, education, policy, immigration, and criminal justice, often with a focus on individualized outcomes.

Danielle Purifoy, assistant professor of Geography and Environment at The University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, will be visiting UGA's Department of Geography on Friday, March 22nd to present the 2024 Globe Lecture. Dr. Purifoy's lecture is titled "Scenes of the Forgotten Black Forest."

About Dr. Purifoy: Danielle Purifoy, JD, Ph.D (she/they), is an assistant professor of Geography and Environment at The University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, where she also serves as a faculty project lead for the UNC Environmental Justice Action Research Clinic. Danielle's research intersects Geography, Law, Environmental Studies, and Black Studies to learn about Black placemaking practices from town formation to ecological stewardship. She is the former Race and Place editor of Scalawag, a media organization devoted to Southern storytelling, journalism, and the arts. You can find her work in Society and Space, Annals of the American Assocation of Geographers, Inside Higher Ed, Environmental Sociology, Scalawag, Southeastern Geographer, Southern Cultures, and Transactions of the Institute of British Geographers, among other publications.

"Scenes of the Forgotten Black Forest" Abstract: Through three scenes in the U.S. South, this article traces alternate histories and epistemic traditions surrounding U.S. forests through Black ecological practices for spiritual, social, and political power. The rich density and network of forest landscapes created possibilities for Black liberation separable, if still arising from, the afterlife of the plantation as the dominant moral, social, and economic framework for the United States' domestic and globalized life-ways.

The burgeoning literature in Black Ecologies signals the importance of Afro-diasporic relations with ecosystems representing the intimate complexities of violent extraction via slavery and simultaneous possibilities for sustenance and freedom. Setting aside forest conservation, one pillar of Western environmentalism, a Black Ecologies approach to forests decommodifies these ecosystems as bundles of resources and reestablishes them as a life-giving geographies offering the possibility of worlds beyond property, plantation, and profit.







UGA Researchers Work to Deploy GeoAI in a Changing World

A new team of UGA researchers has been established to engage in a series of research efforts focused on optimizing geospatial artificial intelligence. The purpose of this research is to enhance and contribute to public safety and resilience, ultimately benefiting communities, society and the environment.



The new research is led by Deepak Mishra, Merle C. Prunty, Jr. Professor, Associate Head in the <u>Department of Geography</u>, and Principal Investigator on the new grants projects. The project investigators also include Andrew Grundstein and Thomas Mote from the Department of Geography, Lakshimish Ramaswamy, Suchendra Bhandarkar and In Kee Kim from the School of Computing, and Guoyu Lu from the College of Engineering. Alan Flurry, Director of Communications for Franklin College, recently explored the team's work and spoke with the investigators in an article for <u>@UGA Research</u>:

"The capability to deploy GeoAl for real-time usage will enable first-responders to react rapidly to changes in terrain around the world resulting from climate change and natural disasters. The campus-wide research effort, which includes faculty from the <u>Franklin</u> <u>College of Arts and Sciences</u> and the <u>College of Engineering</u>, is funded by the U.S. Department of Defense to expand the capabilities of GeoAl models. The work is particularly critical in cold regions around the globe that, as they continue to warm at a rapid pace due to climate change, also become increasingly conducive to commercial shipping, fishing, and other strategic activities. Remote sensing-based terrain awareness builds on existing UGA strengths in satellite-based mapping and modeling, as well as the development of sophisticated 3-D object detection for autonomous navigation applications.

Three new research projects will optimize geospatial artificial intelligence to promote public safety and resilience. Here, a satellite image (left) is shown next to corresponding point clouds, where each point represents height values. UGA Researchers Work to Deploy GeoAI in a Changing World

"The significant expansion in the need for geospatial AI coincides with UGA's explosive growth of capacity across the AI research area," said Deepak Mishra. "Air Force and Army Corps of Engineers' interest in GeoAI comes at a fortuitous time for the university as we buildout and solidify our AI modeling techniques."

"This research seeks to address some of the fundamental challenges in building effective, efficient and practical AI tools for complex Geospatial problems," said Lakshmish Ramaswamy, professor and associate director in the <u>School of Computing</u> and a coprincipal investigator on the projects. "Our goal is to design novel AI architectures, algorithms and systems that take into account the unique characteristics of the geospatial domain."

"By analyzing satellite data with AI to identify terrain features, we plan to create snow and ground condition maps, optimizing route planning and improving travel safety in cold regions," said Andrew Grundstein, professor of geography and co-P.I. on the project.

Mishra said the teams are currently in the sausage-making phase of the project. "We're focused on where it's working and where we have some way to go... the work is progressing, and ultimately the goal is to have the NeRF algorithm to provide to the Army Corps to test in different areas."

The U.S. Forest Service and Geography's Center for Geospatial Research invites volunteers with basic GIS experience to participate in a mapathon aimed at digitizing historical maps of Native American Allotments. In the late 19th century, the U.S. government decided to divide treaty-based reservations into privately-owned lots known as allotments. According to Dr. Rebecca Dobbs of the USFS, the process continued through the first-half of the 20th century, despite obvious problems. Instructors will lead participants in the use of ArcGIS Pro to digitize the boundaries and ownership attributes of the information-rich scanned plat maps.

This event will expose volunteers to the entire process of creating geospatial data from primary records. Volunteers will also gain advanced editing skills in ArcGIS Pro and be able to connect with individuals with similar interests.

Come help transform historic maps of Native American properties into geospatial data ready for modern geoanalytics. Upon approval by USFS researchers, the resulting data will be available for student and faculty research.

GEOAI SEMINAR TODAY: FRIDAY, MARCH 29TH Join Us in Welcoming Dr. Yuhao Kang to UGA Geography



Yuhao Kang, assistant professor in GIScience and the GISense Lab Lead at the University of South Carolina, will be visiting UGA's Department of Geography on Friday, March 29th to host a GeoAI Seminar titled: "Advancing Human Sense of Place with Large Language Models."

About Dr. Kang: Yuhao Kang is an assistant professor in GIScience leading the GISense Lab at the University of South Carolina. He was a postdoctoral researcher at MIT and received his Ph.D. from the University of Wisconsin-Madison. He had working experience at Google X and MoBike. Dr. Kang's research mainly focuses on Human-centered Geospatial Data Science to understand human experience at place and develop ethical and responsible geospatial artificial intelligence (GeoAI) approaches.

By leveraging human-centered geospatial data science, Dr. Kang explores various applications such as public health, real estate, crime, to inform decision-making processes in urban planning. He is the author of 50+ publications with 2300+ Google Scholar citations on journals and conferences in GIS and Urban Studies. He was the recipient for several fellowships and awards, including the Young Researcher Award by the Austrian Academy of Sciences, CaGIS Rising Award, CaGIS scholarship, ICA scholarship, etc. He actively contributed to the GIScience community. He founded the non-profit global education project GISphere with over 20,000 members, served as the associate editor of Computational Urban Science, and board members for the AAG GISS/CyberGIS/Cartography groups and CPGIS.

 <u>Undergraduate Research Opportunities with the Community</u> <u>Mapping Lab</u>

The Community Mapping Lab has several openings for undergraduates seeking research experience over the summer and fall semesters. Our ongoing projects include the following:

- Eviction mapping: Digitize court records for eviction filings and analyze current trends in evictions in the city. GIS skills not required, but helpful. This can potentially include an internship with the ACC Geospatial Office.
- Reese Street Neighborhood mapping: CML is partnering with individuals in the Reese Street neighborhood, an historic African-American community just west of downtown Athens, to create a historic map of the neighborhood based on the 1958 city directory. This work includes working with partners to develop a storymap of residents during that time period and collecting other relevant historical information. Some GIS skills are necessary for this work, but archival research and/or interviewing may also be part of the work.
- Brooklyn Cemetery: This Black cemetery is located behind Clarke Middle School near Alps Road. Previous Community GIS classes worked with Ms. Linda Davis and others to develop datasets showing those buried in this cemetery. Further work is needed to help tell the story of families found in the cemetery and continue improving the accuracy of cemetery records. The work includes both GIS data management and archival research skills.

Each of these opportunities can be in summer and/or fall 2024. Students can receive course credit (Geog4960R) for their work and can also apply for funding through the CURO program. CURO's deadlines are April 15th for summer semester and July 1st for fall.

<u>StoryMapping Queer Climate Justice</u>


