#### **New Research Project to Study Forest Response to Compounded Threats**


Anna Harper, Associate Professor in the Department of Geography, will soon begin leading a new research project titled, "Compound impacts on forest carbon uptake and storage from wind, heat, and drought." The new project, funded by DOE, is set to reveal process-level understanding of how forests respond to compounded threats from heat stress, drought, and wind damage from hurricanes, tropical storms, and other severe storms. This information will be crucial to build better models of the land carbon cycle.

The project is called 'SWAE' (pronounced 'sway') which stands for "Synergistic impacts of Wind And other Extreme events on forest carbon" and is expected to run for two years. Other UGA Geography professors, Thomas Mote and Gabriel Kooperman, will also contribute to the project alongside collaborators at Columbia University, Pacific Northwest National Lab, Lawrence Berkeley Lab, and the UK Met Office/Hadley Centre.

The project will focus on only those within range of hurricanes and tropical storms. Right: Zoom in on the island of Puerto Rico, with tracks of all categorized hurricanes from 1871-2017. The most impactful storms were Hurricanes Hugo (1989), Georges (1998), and Maria (2017).



#### AAG Awards October Deadlines: Nominate Today

We look forward to your nominations for these AAG Awards with deadlines in October. These awards are significant recognitions for geographers, from those just starting their careers to those celebrating decades of leadership.

We hope you will take this opportunity to put a spotlight on geographers who are advancing our discipline and making the world a better place through their work. This is your chance to nominate people who have made an impact on your career, people who inspire you, and people whose ideas and publications are moving the needle on geography as a discipline.

Due October 15, 2024 - **Harold M. Rose Award for Anti-Racism Research and Practice.** This award honors Dr. Harold M. Rose, a past president of AAG who was a pioneer in conducting research on the conditions faced by African Americans.

Due October 31, 2024 - Marble-Boyle Undergraduate Achievement Award Up to three awards per year. Each award consists of a cash prize of \$1,000 and a certificate of recognition, as well as priority consideration by Esri for summer internships. <u>Learn more</u>

#### • Future Faculty Fellows Program

The Future Faculty Fellows Program (3FP), sponsored jointly by the Graduate School and the Center for Teaching and Learning, is a year-long professional development program that brings together 15 innovative and dedicated teaching assistants from across campus to talk about, reflect upon, and improve their teaching, while contributing to their preparation for the academic job market and the rigors of their first faculty positions. Experienced teaching assistants with demonstrated commitment to teaching excellence and who will be preparing for careers in higher education are invited to apply.

#### Eligibility and Selection Criteria

This program is open to full-time UGA graduate students enrolled in terminal degree programs (i.e., doctoral programs, or master's programs for those disciplines for which a doctorate is not typical). Fellows must be full-time students for the duration of the program, and may only participate in the program once. In addition, applicants will be asked to verify that they have met the requirements of UGA's TA Policy. They should have a track record of engagement in significant teaching responsibilities for at least three semesters at UGA (prior to and including the semester of application).

Applications will be evaluated on the basis of their demonstrated dedication and innovation in teaching, and their commitment to providing teaching-related leadership among their peers. Priority will be given to applicants who are within two years of expected degree completion.
