Join Us in Welcoming Dr. Matthew T. Huber to UGA Geography



Matthew T. Huber, Professor of Geography at Syracuse University's Maxwell School of Citizenship and Public Affairs, will be visiting UGA's Department of Geography on Friday, October 25th to present the 2024 Wheeler Lecture. Dr. Huber's lecture is titled "Class Politics for a Planet on Fire."

About Dr. Huber: Matthew T. Huber is a Professor in the Department of Geography and the Environment at Syracuse University. Dr. Huber is a Senior Research Associate for Syracuse University's Program for the Advancement of Research on Conflict and Collaboration (PARCC) which aims to "resolve disputes and foster cooperation in a range of conflict." Dr. Huber also is a Senior Research Associate for Syracuse's Center for Environmental Policy and Administration which focuses on environmental issues.

Dr. Huber received his PhD in Geography from Clark University in 2009. His areas of expertise include Marxism, energy and capitalism, climate politics, and resource geography. He's written numerous journal articles, editorials, essays, and has authored two books, the most recent of which is titled "Climate Change as Class War: Building Socialism on a Warming Planet." 


