LEARNING TECHNOLOGY CONSORTIUM VISIT Over 25 Educators From 10 Universities Visit UGA Geography

On October 20th, over 25 educators from the Learning Technology Consortium, a group of ten universities with common interests in learning and teaching with technology, came to Geography to enjoy an afternoon of presentations and conversations with students and faculty mentors. During the visit, 12 undergraduate and graduate students who are currently members of the Disruptive Geospatial Technologies Lab (DiGTL) at CGR and the Virtual Perception Lab (VPL) in Psychology, demonstrated projects and invited educators to interact with learning technologies being developed and/or used in their labs. The students bring a very rich set of skills to projects being developed by both labs, as they come from multiple units at UGA and major in Geography, Psychology, Computer Science, Cognitive Science, Engineering, Drawing and Painting, Biology, Sociology, and Human Development and Family Sciences (continued on pg. 2).

LEARNING TECHNOLOGY CONSORTIUM (CONT.)

For the visit on October 20th, three technology stations were prepared for interactions, including an augmented reality sandbox; a virtual and augmented reality lab for headsetbased interactions and historical 3D reconstruction demonstrations; as well as an office dedicated to remote sensing from drones, where students had the opportunity to discuss their current implementation of drone-based AI and display 13 drones and multiple remote sensors. The visit is part of a multi-year partnership between DiGTL, VPL and the Center for Teaching and Learning at UGA. Feedback from visitors was extremely positive and students and mentors are thrilled. 




