REFLECTING ON HURRICANE IAN

Exploring the Wired Article: "Hurricane Ian is a Warning From the Future"

Just over a week ago, Hurricane Ian made landfall near the barrier Island of Cayo Costa, Florida. The storm brought unprecedented destruction to a region that hadn't experienced a similar storm in over a decade. Since the storm, media coverage has been intensely focused on rescue efforts, damage assessments, and debates over the meteorological forecasting over the storm.

Media outlets have also reported statements from climatologists and climate change experts warning that storms like Ian will become all too common as climate change goes largely unaddressed. Last week, a Wired article by contributor Meghan Herbst explored statements by climatologists from around the country. The article, titled "Hurricane Ian is a Warning From the Future" quoted UGA Geography/Atmospheric Sciences professor, Dr. Marshall Shepherd. In his statement, Dr. Shepherd makes it clear that storms like Hurricane Ian will continue to cause catastrophic damage as long as human infrastructure is developed in the paths of such significant storms. "In some ways these aren't really natural disasters anymore," says Dr. Shepherd. The article continues to explore the issues surrounding development in areas that are susceptible to damage from increasingly catastrophic storms.



"HONORING LINNENTOWN: A LIVING MOSAIC"

Students and Faculty Contribute to Temporary Installation



On Monday, October 3rd, a temporary "living" mosaic was created at Memorial Hall Plaza to honor the former Linnentown neighborhood. UGA Geography professor Dr. Jennifer Rice collaborated with students in Dr. Lynn-Sanders Bustle's First Year Odyssey (FYO) Art and Activism class on the event. Students, faculty, staff, and community members gathered together to place pieces of tile, mirror, clay medallions, and found objects in the image of a Linnentown home that depicted the vibrancy of the neighborhood. Then, at the end of the event, the mosaic was de-installed (removed) as Ms. Hattie Thomas Whitehead read the names of Linnentown descendants, symbolizing the community's erasure. A key aspect of the event was to show support for the mosaic for which the permanent installation at Baxter and Finley is currently being blocked by USG.







RESEARCH SPOTLIGHT

UGA Geography's Dr. Suzanne Birch Authors Two New Papers UGA Geography and Anthropology Professor Dr. Suzanne Birch has been hard at work this year authoring two new papers that have both been published within the month of October. According to a recent Franklin College press release, Dr. Birch served as coeditor of a special issue in the *Proceedings of the National Academy of Sciences* featuring articles outlining the state of the art in archeological science. The lead article, co-authored by Birch, Current developments and future directions in archaeological science, describes how the field has grown to encompass a wide range of analytical techniques over the past 20 years.

Dr. Birch's second article of the month, Herd management and subsistence practices as inferred from isotopic analysis of animals and plants at Bronze Age Politiko-Troullia, Cyprus, was published in the journal *PLOS One* on October 26th. The article explores the day-to-day subsistence practices of the Bronze Age town, Politiko-Troullia, through faunal analysis. According to the study, "excavated evidence shows that community activities included copper metallurgy (ore processing, smelting and casting), crop cultivation, and rearing of livestock. Additionally, faunal analyses revealed that "the villagers of Politiko-Troullia complemented their management of domesticated animals with hunting of wild deer and feral pigs in the woodlands surrounding their village."


